Administrative burdens, beyond EHRs, are driving a wedge between hospitals and physicians according to new survey

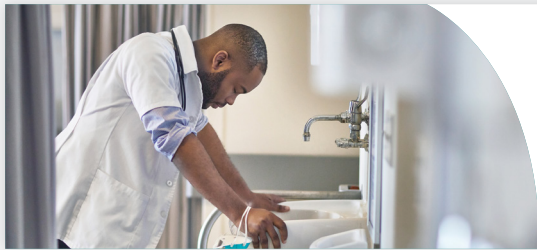
PHYSICIANS HAVE A BLEAK OUTLOOK ABOUT THEIR PROFESSION



68% feel pessimistic or indifferent about their profession



48% describe relationship with their hospital as transactional or combative



BURNOUT CONTINUES TO BE AN ISSUE FOR PHYSICIANS

68% said burnout is an issue

60% said burnout was higher in 2021

ADMINISTRATIVE BURDEN CAN'T BE IGNORED

55% reported spending 1 to 3 hours per day on admin work unrelated to patient care or EHRs

68% of physicians agreed hospitals should alleviate administrative burden to increase satisfaction

83% OF PHYSICIANS AGREED better technology to automate administrative work would help improve productivity
